Legal Alert: Corporate Records Scam

State of Michigan Warns Businesses Not to Fall for a Recent Scam

The Michigan Department of Licensing and Regulatory Affairs (LARA) has recently published a notice urging businesses not to provide any corporate record information over the phone. There have been reports of several Michigan corporations receiving a phone call from (882-014-0325) identifying themselves as a representative from the State of Michigan requesting an annual update of corporate information. This number has been linked to scams in

California, Colorado, Georgia, Massachusetts, Oregon, Pennsylvania and Texas.

LARA warns that these calls are not legitimate and advises companies not to provide any information over the phone.

As policy and practice, LARA mails all legitimate notices to the resident agent at the registered business office. If you receive a contact call or have a question regarding any verification of information, please contact LARA at 517-241-6470.

Rhoades McKee strongly encourages Michigan corporations and limited liability companies to keep thorough records to ensure compliance with applicable law and to preserve their limited liability under the law. ### Is the Affordable Care Act taxing your real estate activities?

As part of the Affordable Care Act of 2010, Congress passed a 3.8% Medicare tax on net investment income. But what does this have to do with your rental real estate activities? Net investment income includes any financial gains from real estate income classified as passive income – and as a general rule, all rental real estate income is considered passive unless you qualify as a materially participating real estate professional or the rental property is considered a self-rental.

### **Materially Participating Real Estate Professional**

To qualify as a real estate professional you need to be able to demonstrate 500 hours of participation in rental activities in the current year, or in five out of the last ten years. If you have more than one rental activity, the option to group all activities together may help to reach the 500-hour requirement.

### Self-Rental

For your rental real estate to be considered a self-rental, you (as the owner of the rental property) must lease the property to a company in which you materially participate. Generally, if you work 500 hours in the company, it's considered material participation; however, there are many tests to determine this.

Consult with a tax professional to determine whether you should be paying the 3.8% Medicare tax on your rental real estate activity.

Recently, Public Act 430 of 2012 amended the DMB Act to provide that for projects funded in whole or in part with state funds, the construction contract award shall be made to the responsive and responsible best value bidder, except as provided relative to veteran's preference.

The qualitative components of the three lowest responsive and responsible bidders will be compared to one another. The comparison may also include other bidders whose bids are within 10% of the lowest responsive and responsible bidder. It is expected that the evaluation may be done through face-to-face or telephone interview. This evaluation will be done primarily by the Professional Services Contractor with assistance from the Project Director of the Design and Construction Division.

The bidders will be evaluated for responsiveness and responsibility based criteria including compliance with all bid specifications and requirements, financial resources, technical capabilities, professional expertise, past performance, insurance and bonding capacity and business integrity.

The bids will be evaluated for best value based on price and qualitative components that may include but are not limited to technical design, technical approach, quality of proposed personnel, and management plans.

For contracts under \$250,000, best value will primarily be based on the lowest responsive and responsible bid.

If a Qualified Disabled Veteran meets the requirements of the contract solicitation and, with the veteran's preference, is the lowest bidder the DTMB Design and Construction Division will enter into the construction contract with the Qualified Disabled Veteran bidder.

### FTCH Awarded Airport Parking Deck Roof Contract —

Builders Exchange Quarterly News spoke with Gerald R. Ford Airport Facilities Director, Tom Ecklund recently regarding the contract award to Fishbeck, Thompson, Carr & Huber for designing the new parking deck roof. "We felt they were the best qualified. They had high energy and have worked on similar projects." stated Ecklund. "They also gave us a number of options to look at and presented possible construction phasing scenarios." The review committee was impressed with the face to face interview.

The \$17.2 million construction project is to complete the roof that was originally included in the 2007 plans. Ecklund said, "The original bids were too high, so we decided not to proceed." However, when the parking deck was completed in 2009, the lack of snow control proved to be a real issue. "That upper level closes in winter and guests are required park in other lots."

The firm was charged with building a roof that is functional, architecturally compatible to the airport canopy, and provide a comfortable visitor experience.

The new roof is funded as part of the Airport's capital budget. The majority of the costs will be on the steel joists, but the plan is to find savings in the roof itself as they compare metal roofs to membrane type roofs. "The membrane roofs are less costly and they give us more design options." said Ecklund.

FTCH is also challenged to determine the feasibility of solar panels on the roof. They will compare the energy benefits gained from the panels to the costs of installing the panels. FTCH will also need to complete a critical glare analysis on the solar panels.

Established in 1956, FTCH is a professional architectural/engineering, civil engineering, environmental, and construction services consulting firm with offices in Grand Rapids, Lansing, Novi, and Kalamazoo, Michigan, and Cincinnati, Ohio. The company reports that years of steady growth have increased the staff to over 360 people. FTCH works with clients from the industrial, governmental, institutional, and private sectors. Their projects range from small feasibility, planning, and regulatory studies to very large design and construction projects. FTCH states its core purpose is to "help people realize their visions while benefiting society."

Two bid packages are planned; Early November for the structural steel, including shop drawings, and the second bid package for the general contractor will occur in the spring. Completion of the roof and opening are slated for Thanksgiving of 2015.

# Interstate Traveler

Building the Hydrogen Super Highway



Builders Exchange met with Justin Sutton, Founder and Managing Partner of The Interstate Traveler Company to get an update on The Interstate Travel company's Hydrogen Super Highway. The Interstate Traveler company's Hydrogen Super Highway, also known as HyRail will allow passengers, automobiles and freight to travel at high speeds along highways and rail roads all across the State that could exceed 300 miles per hour in some ideal locations. The railway cars would travel up to 300 miles per hour and travel from Detroit to Grand Rapids, carrying passengers across the state in only 40 minutes. Passengers would be charged a "by the minute" fare.

The owner believes this project will consist of 100 new buildings in the Metro Detroit and Ann Arbor areas, as well as the construction of 60 visitor stations along I-96 in West Michigan and an additional 14 stations, near airports and hospitals located on the east side of the state. Sutton says, "The construction of these traveler stations can be anything and look like anything." He hopes each of the travel stations will be integrated into their community and that their appearance will reflect the community.

Sutton was in Michigan in mid-September and shared this message as he spoke as a featured presenter at the U.S. Department of Commerce's Minority Business Development Agency (MBDA), 2014 National Training Conference which took place in Detroit. Sutton spent time to update us on the project which is still waiting on finalization, "The Governor has the authority to sign a public and private contract to build the interstate highway connecting Detroit, Ann Arbor, Lansing, Grand Rapids and Muskegon along the interstate. 50 large construction contracts will be available at the same time, and there will be opportunities for local civil engineers and architects galore."

The rail way will create a revenue share that will pay per-capita revenue to the State, the Counties and other Local forms of government like cities, townships and tribal lands across the entire state. Sutton says the project will also fund four Public Trust companies that will distribute a portion of revenue share to medical, education, historical and recreational grant applications.
